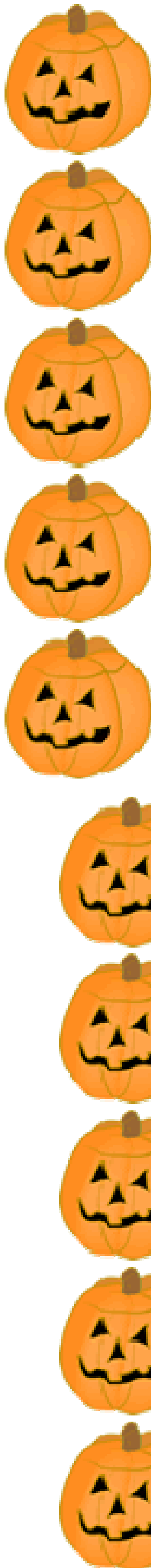


From the Superintendent's Office:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETING OF THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CANASERAGA CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special meeting of the qualified voters of the Canaseraga Central School District shall be held in the Band Room of the Canaseraga Central School in said District on October 27, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. The following proposition will be submitted for voter approval at said meeting:

Resolved that the Board of Education of the Canaseraga Central School District is hereby authorized to establish a Capital Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 3651 of the Education Law (to be known as the "Capital Reserve for Buses"), with the purpose of such fund being to finance cost of the purchase of vehicles for student transportation, the ultimate amount of such fund being to finance cost of the purchase of vehicles for student transportation, the ultimate amount of such fund to be \$500,000, plus earnings thereon, the probable term of such fund to be 10 years, after which time no further funds may be transferred to such Fund, unless previously extended by the voters, but such fund shall continue in existence until liquidated in accordance with the Education Law or until the funds are exhausted, and the sources from which the funds shall be obtained for such Reserve are (i) an initial deposit of up to \$300,000 from available funds, and (ii) amounts from budgetary appropriations from time to time, and (iii) unappropriated fund balance made available by the Board of Education from time to time, and (iv) New York State Aid received and made available by the Board of Education from time to time, all to the extent permitted by law.

AND NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that applications for absentee ballots to vote on the proposition may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk. Any such application must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the date of the aforesaid special district meeting if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before such special district meeting if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. A list of all persons to whom absentee ballots shall have been issued shall be available for public inspection in the office of the District Clerk during regular office hours on each of the five days prior to the day of the vote (excluding Saturday and Sunday), and such list shall also be posted conspicuously at the place of voting. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of such special district meeting.

The District Clerk or the Clerk's designee is hereby directed to publish a copy of said notice of special meeting in two newspapers having general circulation within the School District in the manner prescribed by law for publication of notice of the annual meeting of the School District.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Parent Portal Information:

The Parent Portal on eSchool is a tool to assist parents/guardians in taking an active role in their child's education. Parents/guardians who have an approved account can view, among other things, their child's academic progress through such avenues as posted progress reports and reports cards as well as a grade book feature that posts assignments and running marking period averages.

In order for a parent/guardian to gain this access, they must request an account with the Parent Portal administrator. This request is checked against the student's profile. For safety and security reasons, only parents/guardians of students may gain access to the Parent Portal.

Other News:

Juniors will take the Armed Service Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) exam on Tuesday, Oct. 4. Even if students are not interested in the military, the exam results include an interest inventory to help students determine likes, dislikes and what they may be good at. Students will have the opportunity to learn about their results at the ASVAB Test Interpretation on Thursday, Oct. 13.

Juniors and sophomores have signed up for the PSAT which will be given on Wednesday, Oct. 12. This test is a good "practice run" for the SAT, which students begin taking the spring of their junior year.

The Guidance Office staff will be hosting "College 101" a college information session, on Tuesday, Oct. 18 at 6 p.m. in the band room. We hope this overview of the college application process is informative and helpful to seniors looking at colleges and juniors. Juniors – it's never too early to begin thinking about college.

Upperclassmen doing college searches, financial aid, and scholarship exploration on the Internet are reminded that not all websites are created equal. Unfortunately, many scams exist. If you, or your student, have any doubts about the legitimacy of a website or any other information, please stop in the Guidance Office.

In memory of Jean Weirick, a former third grade at this school, Miss Sramcik donated two beautiful picture books; The Secret River by Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings and The Incredible Book Eating Boy by Oliver Jeffers. The Secret River is the award winning touching story of a young girl Calpurnia who goes on an adventurous quest with her dog, Buggy-Horse to find fish for her father to sell in his shop during hard economic times and discovers a magical river where fish are plentiful. Beautifully illustrated by Leo and Diane Dillon this timeless tale is sure to be a hit with all who read it. The Incredible Book Eating Boy is about a boy who loves books-eating them that is!
