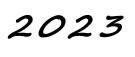

# BUDGET EDITION

**Dear Residents** 

Thank you for your continued support of our school district. Your confidence in our school system is appreciated as we seek to provide as many student opportunities as we can in our small school district. We are attempting to venture into some regional partnerships with other small school districts to provide opportunities that we cannot offer. We are also trying to recruit and retain the best teachers and staff — in a time that presents difficult challenges even finding potential candidates for some of our positions.

One significant change in our financial picture is the addition of our 2019 Capital Project being added to our expenses and revenues. These two figures are the same. The permanent financing costs will be covered by our NYS building aid. Without this increase our expenditures are up a modest 2.15%.

For the 2023-24 school year, the proposed budget results in a projected tax levy increase of 3.37%. This figure meets our tax cap calculation. More tax cap information is listed on page 2.

#### **Budget Proposition:**

That the Board of Education of the Canaseraga Central School District, Allegany County, be and hereby is authorized to spend the sum set forth in the total amount of \$8,320,622 during the 2023—2024 school year and to levy the necessary tax therefore.

#### **Library Proposition:**

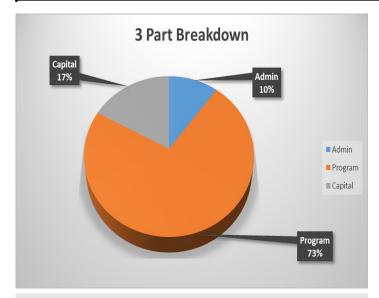
In accordance with state education law (Ed Law 259(1), 255(1) and the Comptroller's Op. #18-167 and #12423 and Real Property Tax Law 1322 and 1324... BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Canaseraga Central School District is authorized to increase the annual tax levy from \$37,750.00 to \$39,250.00 and pay over such funds to the trustees of the Essential Club Free Library.

# BUDGET VOTE & BOARD ELECTION



#### **Administrative Budget**

The administrative portion of this budget includes office and central administrative expenses for all certified school administrators. Included in these expenses are salaries, benefits, equipment, supplies and all costs pertaining to the operation of the Main Office, District Office and Board of Education.

#### **Program Budget**

The program portion of the budget contains all costs for the education of students including salaries, benefits, supplies & materials, BOCES, interscholastic athletics and transportation.

#### **Capital Budget**

The capital portion of the budget covers operations and maintenance department salaries, benefits, supplies, utilities. and other expenses for district facilities. In addition, expenses for debt service are part of the capital budget.

#### PROPERTY TAX CAP INFORMATION

In 2011, New York State passed legislation establishing a property tax cap (Chapter 97 of the Laws of 2011). The tax levy limit is the maximum amount a district can increase their property tax levy from one year to the next with a simple majority vote. This maximum is calculated using a multi-step formula. This formula includes a Tax Base Growth Factor (this year = 0.10%) and an Allowable Growth Factor (this year = 2.0%) that are both set by the state. If a district's tax levy is within the property tax cap limit, a simple majority vote is required to pass the budget.

Canaseraga's proposed tax levy for 2023-24 meets the tax levy limit (3.37%). Therefore, only a simple majority is needed to approve the budget.

### **School District Tax Impact**

Based on a home with an assessed value of \$75,000 and no increase in assessment.

#### **QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS**

A person shall be entitled to vote in any school district election and in all matters placed upon the official ballot; and sign a nominating petition if such person is:

A citizen of the United States; at least 18 years old; a resident of the school district for at least 30 days prior to the meeting.

#### ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Voters who meet the following criteria need to fill out an <u>Application for Absentee Ballot</u> in order to be eligible to receive an Absentee Ballot. Applications are available in the District Office. Absentee ballots must be provided to any qualified voter who will be unable to vote in person due to:

- illness or physical disability, hospitalization (including risks related to COVID-19)
- 2. incarceration
- travel outside the voter's county or city of residence for employment or business reasons, studies, or vacation on the day of the election

The district clerk must receive applications for an absentee ballot at least seven days before the vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter or one day prior to the vote, if in person.
